Page 41, The IIS is raising all information obtained regarding the Tai volunteers to do suicidal activities against American interest in Thailand. Dated 04/09/1990 On 03/09/1990, we have met with Mr. Mehindra Amanik and Mr. Kamina Wastawonkon, from the National Sri Lankan communist student union, as party representative they had declared that they have around 30 members living here in Thailand. They have mentioned to us that their relationship with Iraq goes back to the year 1982, from the time when their president had met with our great president and leader Saddam Hussein god save.
