It was regarding the attack on Iraq and the political reaction of some Arab countries and the United States of America. -One of the participants said that if the United States of America and its allies objected to the Soviet Union initiation, Iraq is going to cooperate with the Kuwaiti political and religious organizations in order to erect a national rule. - It was mentioned that Egyptian religious leaders were supporting the Kuwaiti government. -One of the participants suggested establishing an Iraqi radio station to broadcast the corruption that took place in Gulf. -They talked about the American political position regarding the attack on Kuwait. -Some of the participants suggested having Palestinians to assassinate the Kuwaiti Leader after entering Kuwait. -They talked about Al-Qazzafi informative interview on Monte Carlo radio channel. SADDAM:	We will sit down with Commander Latif and discuss it with him. We will request to speak with his employers to convene with us about the problem, just as we sit down with our army troops, with our farmers and withuntil we are completely convinced, then we offer our support and assistance, or at least solve their problems.
