Male 1	Shooting, this is a breach of resolution 707, which means resolution of year 1991, resolution for all areas.
Male 2	Resolution of Confiscation
Male 1	<p>Confiscation, they started preparing for the deliberation meeting on the 18th day. They didn't present a legislated resolution. They came out of the meeting and asked to meet with the Nonaligned Group. They met with the nonaligned; they want to scare them, what is that? And most of them are not even scared at all. They also proved that they are about to do something, and that the Iraqi violation is a very dangerous violation.</p> <p>Mr. Tariq's letter showed that Mr. Ekeus lied several times during his briefing and even contradicted with what was recorded between the Iraqi side and the Inspectors teams. He lied about two helicopters while en route to a sensitive location as agreed, and then he reiterated that the two helicopters were carrying documents or carrying forbidden materials. This is what he is telling the Security Council. Meanwhile it is officially recorded between the Iraqis and the Inspectors teams that the two (helicopters) flew, the head of the Inspection team said, "Bring them back" and they brought them back. They came and asked the pilots and then determined [Inaudible] normal exercise flights.</p> <p>The head of the inspection team reported it as a normal flight, which it was not. He sits at the Security Council and claims they flew two airplanes and transferred documents on them.</p> <p>They went to the security institute or Tikrit institute maybe, one of the institute employees has notebooks, his own notebook, notebooks you know, students write on scratch books, you know, usually all scratch books are burned after some time. They came and said that these guys are burning documents -- Ekeus said to the Security Council, these guys are burning documents. The accident, as it's recorded with the head of the Inspection team, is that he came and asked, "What are they burning?" They told him "questions and practice and so on notebooks." There were parts of incomplete notebooks. They flipped and saw them and translated them verbally. He said, "We thought they were documents." Ekeus said at the Security Council, "They burned very important documents," and so on, with these kinds of lies to serve their plan.</p> <p>Of course, every lie came from the Iraqi side and in truth, as it happened, the whole schedule (TC: said sarcastically, inferring that anything the Iraqis say will be believed as lies).</p> <p>The most important, Mr. President the leader, on the 19<sup>th</sup> the Americans presented a draft, a draft resolution, beside the simple reading of it, the real contents of it means the following, Mr. President the Leader:</p>

Male 1 (cont.)	<p>First: Transferring the Political Authorities from the Security Council to the Special Commission in regards to reviewing the sanctions that are imposed on Iraq, which means the Special Commission is the one that decides if there was improvement or not. And we concluded that whatever happened then is the same now, only the decision regarding the sanctions will be in the hands of the Special Commission and not in the hands of the Security Council.</p> <p>This why the Russian, Chinese and the Egyptian, and -- sorry to say, apparently the French, said that this transfer is on the authority of the Security Council to the Special Commission, and this doesn't comply with the United Nations Charter.</p> <p>The Second thing is: impose new sanctions on Iraq; that all the Iraqi officials cannot travel and not all countries will grant them visas.</p>
Male 2	And the police families and the Army's families.
Male 1	<p>Also the police and the Armed Force's families and the first class families, except persons who are related to the resolution 986, should ask for the approval from the Boycotting Committee.</p> <p>Respect Iraq's integrity soil &amp; water unity.</p>
Male 2	[Inaudible]
Male 1	Concentration focused on the two resolutions, Mr. President the Leader, 715, which are for continued Monitoring and 707, which is for permission and resolution of Confiscation.
Male 2	This means every car, every person, and any house.
Male 1	<p>Anytime, any house, any place, any moment. It means Iraq was rejected and it is still rejected. It was clear, Mr. President the leader, that they intimidate some countries and some did respond, except Kenya said a little... and Portugal, Poland, Japan, Costa Rica, Chili, Korea, Sweden, Guinea Bissau, ...ten, which means they are going ahead for the 19<sup>th</sup>, going ahead with the resolution. The Russians asked them, "Are you talking about the problems with the Special Commission? Or do you want to change the Political Regime in Iraq? We want to understand this. And we won't accept this." The Chinese were clearer than the Russians and asked, "You know my country is against the boycott and the sanction to begin with, and this issue is not accepted. On the other hand, we do have some inquires. You said that the Iraqis prevent you from inspections on 10<sup>th</sup> &amp; 12<sup>th</sup>, why did you keep that quiet? Did the inspections take place? Did they prevent you? We want to know the facts. You guys concentrated only on those two days?" The second question Ekeus asked, "Were they prevented because they are hiding?" Why doesn't he bring us evidence? He did many inspections and so on. Let him tell us where the evidence is? We want the evidence here. The Egyptians' stand is no less than the Chinese, and the language that the Egyptians are using is kind of soft, and it's not bad. They said, "We are against transferring the Political Authorities of the Council to this Commission. We have the Arab League that justifies logically the Arab Regions. We can't prevent the Iraqi Officials from coming. How can we not give them visas?"</p>

Male 2	[Inaudible] Arab League meetings.
Male 1	<p>So, my President the Leader, from the first day with Mr. Tariq, he arrived in Amman on his way to Paris. We agreed not to waste energy with those who are nonaligned, and will concentrate on the three permanent and Egypt. We asked the Russians and the Chinese Thursday night and asked to bring the French also. I sent for them late at night and we demanded the use of veto. We asked them officially and, on Friday, I asked them to come again. Mr. Tariq left for Paris.</p> <p>The second time we told them, just like we said, look at the resolution, the Americans will start again because they reached their level of cruelty, so when they start giving and they will tell you let's sit and negotiate and you bring us your approval. We are letting you know ahead of time that any detraction or modification under the modification chart is not going to do any good but harm. So please, we are asking you the right to veto, and this issue is unconditional, we ask your governments to do with respect.</p> <p>Mr. Tariq called me and couldn't talk on the phone, he asked to use a tactic. We will ask for a Technical Veto to buy time, so I asked for them a second time, we asked Russia, sorry Sir because the Chinese don't use this method. So I asked for the ambassador yesterday almost at midnight, and I told him we want to use the Technical Veto, which means we will not accept the resolution and need time to present something. And when you ask for the Technical Veto right the other side will expect something in return, so we told the Russians we want Technical Veto right, and it looks like they are thinking the same thing.</p>
Male 2	It means the Russians will ask for the technical veto so they can present a substitute.
Male 1	<p>Yes, Sir, so they can present a substitute, and sure enough they are thinking of using a technical veto right. They might want something. They prepared the resolution draft. We received the resolution draft today. The draft only condemns Iraq no more and no less.</p> <p>The Chinese are equal to the Russians but they won't accept the language. They came to Nazar and told him they are not happy with it and to tone it down, as tactic you want us to be with the Russians and adopt this resolution. This afternoon Nazar said "Yes" to them, then I responded to him immediately and told him "no".</p>
Male 2	The Chinese are to interfere to modify the resolution.
Male 1	Yes Sir, the Resolution.
Male 2	Why would they be adopted?

Male 1	<p>Yes, when the committee of the Four Comrades ordered this, I went to execute the order. Nazar came to me, I told him "No", even though you told them "yes." You rushed, go back to him and tell him "No."</p> <p>First, you don't rush at all. Don't consult with the Russians. The Russian doesn't expect you to be against him. We want you to be a weight for the Russian, for improvement. We want you to present a statement plan so you can take a stand and even say to the Russian, we want a statement plan not a</p>

	<p>resolution plan. I told Nazar run to him and tell him please adopt this direction.</p> <p>The Americans came and did modifications and said “No,” Iraqi official employees are not prevented, only the armed forces and Military Industry. The replies, Mr. President the Leader, there are some things that are very beneficiary, how the Americans and especially the British, the Russian presented a resolution plan</p>
Male 2	<p>What does the one have to do with other, if the citizens or the armed forces or the Military industry, what does this has to do with the pilot who was prevented from flying over the Presidential Sites? What is the link?</p>
Male 1	<p>There is no link Sir, it is poison and disrespect.</p>
Male 2	<p>When we were kids, I saw a situation in Tikrit and I was surprised of it because I just came from the countryside. Two were fighting, and one of them tells the other, “Hold me, hold me,” and he doesn’t hit him, harassing him and screaming. -- We have the same here. They are cursing and saying, “hold me back, hold me back.”</p>
Male 3	<p>[Inaudible] the French position is still calling for condemnation, and preventing the Iraqis from traveling, is not accepted, [Inaudible].</p>
Male 2	<p>They are not coordinated, because while in flight they arrive at a location. Suddenly, when they approach the Presidential place, he turns around and positions himself over the Presidential Site. The Presidential Sites have their clear orders that any plane, regardless whether Iraqi or foreign, don’t bother yourself with making a distinction. There were accidents where they shot at our planes, so you have to fire immediately without asking for information. So he rescued them and rescued himself. You can tell him over the telephone too. Firstly they asked to go to this Site, suddenly they changed their route, this site is a Presidential Site --and the orders for the Presidential Sites are very clear. Tell them this, they have clear directives regarding any airplanes. Don’t use Air Defense. Regardless of nationality, shoot them. So he saved his life and their lives, as a matter of fact, he didn’t put my life in danger.</p>

Male 2	<p>From the Media aspect, you need to put out statements, meaning these statements and information about the Presidential Sites and what happened.</p>
Male 1	<p>My Sir President the Leader, Mr. Tariq Aziz’s letter in this regard can build up to other things, we have details.</p>
Male 2	<p>Don’t keep quiet. The whole world is talking, only you are silent. Talk about your issue so [Inaudible]. The world is listening only to the biased side.</p> <p>Other politics, other areas.</p>
Male 1	<p>Today the Iranian emissary was honored to meet you, Mr. President the Leader.</p>
Male 2	<p>He carried a letter from President Rafsanjani, an invitation to the Conference. I told him, God willing, when the conference takes place, Iraq will attend.</p> <p>But I told him, when the Iraqis don’t see the words “Peace be upon you” on</p>

	<p>President Rafsanjani's letter, the Iraqis ask whomever is going to the conference: why would you travel to a country that didn't give you "Peace"? So if we...the foreign ministry prepared once a letter in the President's name to one of the African Presidents. He brought up this note and we thanked him. We even mentioned it and took notice and told him your note was right and we thanked him for his note.</p> <p>So take the message to President Rafsanjani, regardless, Iraq will attend. It has no "Peace be upon you" either, at the beginning nor at the end, same as Khomeini's mentality when he said, "Peace be upon those who followed the right guidance."</p>
Male 1	Sir. President the Leader, he panicked and apologized, because I met him at 4:30 pm.
Male 2	Maybe all Presidents [Inaudible].
Male 1	Yes [Inaudible] most of them are like this.
Male 2	Based on the classical wording it has no "Peace be upon you." Let us direct our ambassadors to detect and mobilize Country Leaders and the Kings on this issue, if the letter that went to them is like this letter...what, yes nothing wrong with it.
Male 3	[Inaudible]
Male 1	Yes, Yes.
Male 2	We will tell them that the letter we received didn't have "Peace be upon you"; does your letter have it? Did you check it? And if their letter has no "Peace be upon you", we will try to send it to the Arab Media. Our ambassadors, Press Attaché will take care of this.
Male 3	[Inaudible] Islamic Conference not Technology Conference.
Male 2	If, God willing, you went, comrade Taha, at that time we will decide on the issue. Keep in mind, that this means you greet and say "(Peace be upon you and God's Mercy) attending gentlemen or attending brothers", even though the letter we received from President Rafsanjani didn't indicate the word "Peace", which is given in God's name and at the same time is a kind of praise and honesty in brotherly relations for the speakers and attendees. With that I say to President Rafsanjani, "Peace be upon you", in order to embarrass him, [Inaudible].
